






Mounting kit **PAN170** to fix **legs** to the benches








Exploded view








Warnings

General

- Do not use any sharp tools to open the packaging.
- We strongly advise against using power tools.
- · Tripping hazard, mind your step.
- Do not put out cigarettes on the table.
- Not grafitti proof.
- Do not leave children unattended whilst playing on the table.
- To avoid danger of suffocation, keep plastic bags away from babies and children.
- Colors can differ over years and from batch to batch.

Product

- Do not stand or jump on the Lazy Susan and/or table.
- Do not drag the table, but carry it with minimum 2 people.
- Anchoring the product has to be done by qualified people.
- For anchoring: use suitable bolts or screws from a specialized store depending on the material your terrace is made of.
- The white Lazy Susan reflects in the sunlight.
- Mind your fingers whilst assembling the Lazy Susan.
- Max. 3 people or 240 kg per bench.

Wood

- · When delivered, the wood is untreated.
- Wood is a natural material and its look is different for every slat, plank and tree.
- Wood will gradually become rougher and start to turn grey as a consequence of exposure to the sun and rain. We recommend oiling the wood once or twice a year. 1x before the Summer and 1x after the Summer as protection for the Winter.
- Cleaning regularly with mild detergent. Never use a high pressure

- cleaner as this will roughen the wood's smooth surface and irreparably damage the wood's fibress.
- Thorough cleaning with Extremis Wood Cleaner.
- We strongly recommend that you treat your wood with wood oil to protect it from stains - Small cracks and crevices can also appear as part of this process. We strongly advise everyone to treat the furniture with our Wood Protector. It is best to repeat this treatment each year.

Galvanized steel

- Galvanization will become less shiny when used outdoors.
- Flame retarding NEN-EN13501-1 A1 Class A1 products will not contribute to fire in any stage, including fully developed fire. For this reason, they are assumed to be capable of satisfying all requirements of all lower classes as well.
- Possible impurities in the immersion tank can cause black marks during galvanization, which are intrinsic to this industrial finishing technique.
- White marks on this zinc layer are also intrinsic to this procedure and will disappear when the furniture is put outdoors.
- This industrial finishing technique may result in a rougher surface.
 This is intrinsic to the process.

Powder coating

- White powder coating requires more maintenance.
- Do not use abrasive scouring powders or scourers as they will scratch the surface.
- Color can fade to some extent when exposed to UV.
- Flame retarding NEN-EN13501-1 A2-sl Satisfying the same criteria
 as Class B for the SBI-test according to EN13823. In addition,
 under conditions of a fully developed fire these products will nog
 significantly contribute to the fire load and fire growth.
- Dark colors can get very hot in sunny weather.

• UV color fastness: >6 (EN438-2:27) en (ASTM G53-91)

Sunbrella

- Not waterproof, store inside!
- · Shake or brush off loose dirt immediately.
- UV color fasteness: 7/8 (ISO 105-B02).



Assembly text instructions



Take a look at the drawings, starting from page 11

Pantagruel picnic (p11)

- Secure the support and the base plate (or the optional floor fastening plate, with the hole directed to the centre. Use the fixing media most suited to the type of ground on which you intend to install the Pantagruel) to the leg with 2 bolts M8x25, do not tighten it completely yet. Repeat this for all the legs!
- 2. Put the bench upside down on a table (use the packaging as protection) & assemble the leg with 4 bolts M8x16 & the corrugated spring wshers M8. After the bench is assembled, you can tighten the bolts of the base plate completely.
- 3. Put the tabletop diagonally on the trestles.
- 4. Secure the legs with the bench to the tabletop with 4 bolts M10x25. After assembling the first leg, mount the opposite leg to maintain balance.
- 5. Loosen the Lazy Susan by unscrewing the bolt & nut on the bottom of the tabletop and by removing the stainless steel plate.
- 6. Remove the Lazy Susan.
- 7. Assemble the wheels to the axles with 4 bolts M6x16 and flat washers M6. Attention: tighten the bolts, but do not fully tighten them.
- 8. Put the Lazy Susan and the stainless steel disk in the tabletop.

 Optional Lazy Susan anchoring: If you would like to anchor the Lazy Susan, you can assemble the stainless steel plate again on the bottom of the tabletop. Use the extra lock nut instead of the regular



nut. This is a sustainable solution. Do not tighten the extra lock nut too much so the lazy susan can still rotate freely.

Backrest (p17)

- 1. Insert the two clips (per backrest) between the 2nd and 3rd plank, with its opening pointing towards the floor.
- 2. Hold the backrest so that the holes in the flat parts are situated just below the holes in the clips. Two people are needed for this part of assembly. Put the bolts through the hole in the backrest and tighten then in the clips. Firmly tighten the bolts to prevent them from loosening spontaneously.

With Inumbra (p19)

- 1. Remove the Lazy Susan and the little disk.
- 2. Put the Inumbra connection piece in the middle of the tabletop. Make sure that its conical part is facing upwards. Fasten the insert to the table, putting the bolts through the bottom of the table.
- 3. Put the Lazy Susan back.
- 4. Place the Inumbra on the connection piece and fasten it by inserting the handle provided into the lowest hole of the tube and tightening it. Now open the parasol by inserting the handle into the highest hole in the tube and turning it. The parasol should always be fully opened or completely closed.

With Inumbrina (p22)

- Remove the Lazy Susan and the little disk.
- 2. Remove the rotary knob from the connection piece.
- 3. Put the Inumbrina large connection piece in the middle of the tabletop. Make sure that the cylindrical part is facing downwards and the square plate is facing upwards. Fasten the insert to the table, putting the bolts through the bottom of the table.
- 4. Put the Lazy Susan back and insert the Inumbrina into the table.

- 5. Reattach the rotary knob to the connection piece.
- 6. Lock it by tightening the rotary knob clockwise. The Inumbrina is only properly locked into place if it can no longer spin on its axis.
- 7. **a.** To open the parasol, pull hard on the rope until the crown meets the bolt.
 - **b.** To close it again, hold the rope at an angle as you release it. <u>TIP</u>: continue to hold the rope at an angle until the parasol is completely closed. <u>The parasol should always be fully opened or completely</u> closed.
- 8. Now insert the rope into the provided hole in the parasol tube.

Wood

DAY TO DAY CLEANING

Clean regularly and after every use

Wood doesn't need much maintenance, but the better you treat it, the longer it will last. Cleaning the wood regularly and immediately after use with a damp cloth will prevent fluids from penetrating deep into the wood. An oiled table will absorb liquids less quickly, keeping it clean for longer. To remove stubborn remains of dirt, simply use a stiff brush and some water. Be careful not to permanently damage the fibres. For this reason, never ever use a high-pressure cleaner to clean wood.

CLEANING

Once or twice a year

Depending on the weather conditions, wood needs a descent polish at least once a year. We would recommend to do this before Spring and before Winter, if your furniture is outside the whole year round. Pick one of those humid, cloudy days, as it is better for the moisture level in the wood to dry out slowly after cleaning. For a thorough cleaning, we can recommend our Extremis Wood Cleaner. This is a bio-degradable cleansing shampoo for wooden furniture. The product removes grey discolouration, green deposits and dirt. Should any cracks appear, you can simply sand them down by hand using 120 grit sandpaper.



OILING

Once a year

You are free to protect your wood from UV, inclement weather and stains. Needless to say we strongly recommend to do this once a year. Extremis Wood Protector is a 100% natural product based on linseed oil. It is colourless, but the wood will be darker after this treatment. Remove all residues of old applications.

MACHINE SANDING

Only every 2 to 4 years

After a few years, there will be little cracks and maybe some warping in your wood. This is completely normal, because wood is a natural, living material. Solid wood has the great benefit that you can sand away the top layer to make the surface smooth and flat again. You can do this every two to four years with a hand-held sander. Do it on a dry day. Use 120-grit sandpaper for this.

REPLACING A WOODEN PART

Hey! You don't need to be an engineer to understand our products. And you don't even need to be great at DIY to replace a part. Do make sure that you can't repair the damage simply by sanding the slat.

CLEANING

When dirty

Clean with lukewarm water and a brush.

REPARING DAMAGED PARTS WITH ZINC SPRAY

When damaged

Hot dip galvanization is the most durable way of protecting metal against rusting. If the zinc coating is damaged, the exposed metal can rust. This can easily be touched up with zinc paint that automatically



has the same colour and is readily available in shops. Zinc spray forms a quick drying, self healing and flexible coating that helps stop corrosion.

Powder coating

CLEANING

Regularly

Use Extremis Multicleaner, a 100% biodegradable detergent or common kitchen cleaning products. Avoid using aggressive products. These surfaces are best cleaned with a neutral cleaning product diluted in water.

REPAIRING DAMAGED POWDER COATING

When damaged

The impact of sharp objects can damage the coating. Scratches or dents can be touched up with our paint pens. However this only camouflages the scratches without removing them.

HPL

SPILLED LIQUIDS

Immediately after use

Spilled liquids should be removed immediately with a clean, soft cloth, particularly in case of dark-coloured liquids such as wine, ink, coffee, coke, oil and bird droppings. If left to dry, these liquids may cause permanent damage!

CLEANING

Regularly and after every use

Use Extremis Multicleaner, a 100% biodegradable detergent or common kitchen cleaning products. Avoid using aggressive products. These surfaces are best cleaned with a neutral cleaning product diluted in water.



Sunbrella

SPILLED LIQUIDS

Immediately after use

It is best to treat spilt liquids immediately by placing a sheet of absorbent kitchen paper on them. The water-resistant coating on the Sunbrella prevents droplets from penetrating the fabric.

REGULAR CLEANING

When dirty

Make a solution to remove stains on your Sunbrella.

MACHINE WASHING

Rarely

It is also possible to put the blankets and cushion covers in a washing machine (30°). Do not dry clean or tumble dry. The fabric can be creased. Ironing will help to recover the waterrepellent coating of the fabric, but only at a cool setting (delicates). As some irons exceed the recommended temperature at the synthetic setting, test a small, inconspicuous area before ironing the entire fabric. DO NOT use a steamer or iron set to the steam setting.

REMOVING STUBBORN STAINS

Only if nothing else helps

More drastic measures needed? Bleach can be used if nothing else helps. Protect the area around your Sunbrella fabric when using a bleach solution – bleach may discolour non-Sunbrella fabrics. Please be aware of the environment when cleaning with bleach. Bleach can have harmful effects on the natural environment around you. We do not advise using bleach if you are surrounded by a body of water or another environment that could be affected. If stains and/or mildew marks are severe, the quantity of bleach may be increased.
